# **Chore services (CH1)**

# SAS service code

## A. General description:

Chore services (CH1) are services that help maintain a clean, sanitary, and safe living environment for persons that are unable to complete chore activities on their own.

### B. Population served:

Persons with intellectual disabilities, related conditions (ID, RC) and/or adults age 18 and older with acquired brain injury (ABI) as defined in Utah Administrative Code, Rule R539-1 and are receiving Department of Health & Human Services Division of Services for People with Disabilities (DHHS DSPD) self-administered services (SAS).

### C. Direct service requirements:

- 1. All general SAS service requirements shall be implemented.
- 2. CH1 shall be provided only in cases were no other relative, caregiver, landlord, or volunteer agency is capable of or responsible for the chore.
- 3. When the residence is a rental property, the responsibilities of the landlord pursuant to the lease agreement shall be reviewed prior to authorization of CH1 services.
- 4. CH1 may include:
  - a. washing floors, walls and windows.
  - b. snow removal
  - c. lawn care
  - d. securing loose rugs and tiles
  - e. moving heavy furniture to provide safe access

#### D. Limitations:

#### CHI shall **not** be:

- 1. Provided or billed at the same time persons are receiving the following service codes: ELS, PA1, PPS, HHS, RHS, SL1, SLH or SLN.
- 2. A skills training service.

### E. Employee qualifications:

The employee shall:

1. Meet all general SAS staff qualifications.

2. Be capable of heavy lifting and physically completing all required tasks.

# F. Specific training requirements:

- 1. General SAS service training requirements shall be completed before providing services.
- 2. Maintaining a clean, sanitary and safe living environment in the person's home.

# G. Rate:

CH1 is a one-to-one quarter hour service.
