What is the Limited Supports Waiver?

- This is a lifelong program for individuals with intellectual disabilities, other related conditions, or acquired brain injuries.
- It is designed to provide services throughout the state which help people of all ages to remain in their homes and be able to direct their support services, and live as independently as possible.
- As of January 2025, the waiver has an individual spending cap of \$21,676 per year for all Medicaid approved individuals and \$7,622 for those who do not qualify. The waiver's limited service options allow people with disabilities, their families, and support teams to have flexibility in determining and changing their needed services.
- This program serves a limited number of individuals based on available funding.
- There is a waiting list for this waiver program.
- Individuals interested in a more comprehensive waiver are able to receive LSW services while waiting for enrollment on those other waivers.

Eligibility

- Must meet financial eligibility requirements for Medicaid, and
- Be eligible for Division of Services for People with Disabilities (DSPD) services with an intellectual disability, related condition, or acquired brain injury level of care,
- Must be able to live safely in the community and can be healthy and safe while using the LSW.

The process

1. A support coordinator meets with you and educates you about what services are available on the LSW and answers questions about what you want and need. You can bring anyone you want to help you answer the questions.
2. Choose what service delivery you want to use, Self Administered Supports (SAS) or contracted services providers.
3. Enroll in SAS services and hire you employees and/or meet with services providers and choose who you want to work with.
4. Create goals that are important to you.
5. Monitor ongoing services and change them when needed.
